Hong Kong interior woodwork company Decca Home has added a new collection to its portfolio. Inversion was inspired by French cabinetmaking traditions, with their classical silhouettes, and use of dark and light timber. "With straight and curved contours, masculine and feminine, in light or dark variations, the pieces complement each other as members of a large family in a rendition of tables and consoles, multifunctional furniture, sideboards and a variety of seats," says the firm. "The collection reinvents a genre: furniture of character, simple in appearance; which, despite its lack of superfluous frills, is far from having a minimalist design; in reality, furniture that is easy to live with, contemporary and adorned with a very Parisian elegance."
