The Cellar Door, Ringwood

Located in the town square of the newly revamped Eastland Shopping Centre, The Cellar Door is a unique hybrid of restaurant, public bar and retail space showcasing local goods, but its best-kept secret can be found on the roof. The rooftop garden is where people who work in the area gather on their lunch break. Densely populated with an array of herbs (mint, parsley and thyme), vegetable plants (broccoli, cabbage and eggplant) and fruit trees (lemon, lime and olives), the garden was designed to provide a functional food source for the restaurant, as well as a space for the community to enjoy. phillipwithers.com

The RSPCA has undertaken a long-term plan to rejuvenate its complete site. Two keys areas with a high priority are the memorial garden and the main entrance.

The memorial garden is a place of calm reflection. Alpine stone cladding was selected for its calm tones and colour connection to the surrounding landscape. It's easy to install and timeless in colour and pattern. Seating has a galvanised and powder-coated frame with hardwood slats for longevity and a clean look. The paving is crushed granite which allows for water penetration, while still delivering a safe and hard-wearing pedestrian surface. outhousedesign.com.au
